Academic Updates

ELA - Sixth-grade students are currently in the informational unit for Language Arts. In this unit, we read and analyze informational texts while focusing on the main idea and supporting details, summarizing, text structure, research, and making inferences. We will focus on constructed responses and informational essays for our writing standards. In class, students are reading <u>Zane and the Hurricane</u> or <u>The Cay</u>.

Students are responsible for ELA morning work. Many students complete this work during homeroom, but if students are unable, they should complete it at home. Our morning work typically consists of a short passage and two questions. Students also are reading a book of their choice. Please remember all students should aim to read for 20 minutes each weeknight.

Students have been learning how to find the mean of a data set by using fair share, a balance point and an algorithm. We will move on to finding the median, mode and range. Later in the unit, we determine the best graph to use when displaying data and how to create those graphs. The unit ends with reading and interpreting data from graphs. <u>Our next unit introduces students to relevant</u> <u>connections through number system fluency. Our next</u> <u>unit begins with building fluency with addition,</u> <u>subtraction, multiplication and division.</u> Students can perform operations with multi-digit decimal numbers fluently using models and student selected strategies.

Please remember that students have their spiral review to work on each night. Students receive the weekly review on Friday for the following week from their homeroom teacher. Many students are completing this during homeroom but please check with them to make sure it is completed before they come to school.

The spiral review is designed to review those skills that have been covered so students maintain an understanding throughout the school year.

For September, we will continue with our world studies of Europe. We finished our unit on the physical and political geography of Europe and the unit covering the environmental factors within the country. Our first Unit Test will be Wednesday, September 6th. 
