## Academic Updates

### **ELA**

As we continue to learn to write five paragraph informational essays, we will focus on and write about the First Thanksgiving. Through various sources of information, students will practice writing well-developed sentences, identifying main ideas, and using key details as text evidence. Students will develop the topic with facts, definitions, concrete details, quotations, and/or other examples about the First Thanksgiving. We will work on prepositions and interjections in grammar.

During December, students will begin exploring the narrative writing genre. We will develop the complete story arc while focusing on sensory details and dialogue to express the character's point of view. In grammar, we will cover figurative language.

Students should remember to complete their 2 Reading Plus reading lessons each week to 80% or higher. Don't forget to keep reading with your kids every day!

## Math

We are continuing Unit 3:Building Conceptual Understanding of Multiplication and Division with Whole Numbers. We have spent a few weeks practicing how to solve multi-digit multiplication problems using a variety of strategies (area model, partial products, and standard algorithm). We are now transitioning to solving multi-digit division problems by two-digit divisors that are less than 25. Students can choose the strategy that works best for them to solve. Please have your student practice their multiplication and division facts. Thank you for your continued support.
